Prostate Cancer Info Sheet

Men 45+ should understand their PSA Number!

- Most men without prostate cancer have PSA levels under 4 ng/mL of blood.
- Men with a PSA level between 4 and 10 (often called the "borderline range") have about a 1 in 4 chance of having prostate cancer.
- Elevated levels could signal prostate cancer or a different prostate-related condition – enlarged prostate (benign prostatic hyperplasia or BPH), inflammation of the prostate (prostatitis), a urinary tract infection or even natural aging process.








FAMILY **HISTORY**

Having a father or brother with *prostate cancer* more than doubles the risk of developing this disease.



313,780 NEW CASES

of **prostate cancer** are estimaged to be diagnosed this year in the US.



5-YEAR SURVIVAL RATES BY STAGES

According to American Cancer Society, the five-year survival rate for both localized cancer (that has not spread beyond the prostate) and regional cancer (that has not spread beyond nearby structures and lymph nodes) is nearly 100%.
